Points Discussed:

 It was highlighted by the Hon'ble VC that based on past admissions, the combined intake for BBA Specialisations i.e. Business Analytics, Digital Marketing & Entrepreneurship & Family Business has been decided as 50 for the Academic year 2024-25.

B. UPDATE ON PLACEMENTS

It was brought out that a presentation was made by Director CPAA in the 38th Board of Management Meeting held on 31st January 2024 briefing the Members on the status of placements, plan for the students not placed so far, activities calendar for the next 2 months and the Alumni activities planned in the even semester (Jan-June 2024). Post discussions it was decided that the CPAA should engage in comprehensive discussions with companies to discern the specific skill sets they are seeking in the students to identify any existing gaps. With regards the low numbers of company that

have visited the campus so far, the Director CPAA had brought out that besides the 62 companies that have visited till date, 50 more are lined up to visit in the month of Feb/ March 2024. He highlighted a shift in the hiring strategy of companies, indicating a move away from bulk recruitment. Instead, companies now focus on specific skill set and certification requirements before the conduct of interviews. Dr. Rohit also brought out the impact of COVID-19 on the IT sector, where companies initially hired extensively due to requirements in those days, but are now downsizing their manpower. The necessity for enhanced coordination between the CPAA and various departments was emphasized in order to facilitate a more comprehensive understanding of companies' requirements. Also, the importance of conducting Exit Interviews with companies to obtain feedback for facilitating a meaningful gap analysis for the purpose of identifying areas of improvement was highlighted.

C. ACADEMIC CALENDAR PRESENTED BY DEAN ACADEMICS FOR THE EVEN SEMESTER (JAN – JUN 2024) FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2023-24.

The Academic Calendar for the Even Semester (Jan-June 2024) of Academic Year 2023-24 was deliberated and approved by the Board of Management in its 39th meeting held on 31 Jan 2024. Details are placed at **Annexure 2**.

D. CONDUCT OF CONVOCATION CEREMONY

During the 39th meeting of the Board of Management held on 31 Jan 2024, the Member Secretary had brought out that the Convocation Ceremony for conferring degrees and awards to graduating students is the culmination of years of hard work by the students and is an important and solemn occasion for the university. He highlighted that to continuously improve the convocation experience, based on past years convocation ceremonies, the conduct of future convocation ceremonies has been re-examined, and presented two options for conduct of future convocations. Post discussions on the subject, the members of the Board of Management decided that a small core group should examine various options with their pros and cons, and propose a suitable option, which can be approved subsequently.

E. EXPULSION FROM UNIVERSITY FOR ADOPTING UNFAIR MEANS DURING MAJOR EXAMS – TWO STUDENTS

The member secretary brought out that two students (20BBA044) Tushar Rana and (20BBA019) Jatin Yadav were caught using unfair means during the major examinations conducted in Dec 2023. On examination it emerged that they were repeat offenders and had been caught using unfair means earlier also. Being repeat offenders, the students were expelled from the university with effect from 10 Jan 2024. During the 39th meeting of the Board of Management held on 31 Jan 2024, the Member Secretary brought out that (20BBA019) Jatin Yadav had filed a plea in response to his expulsion, apologizing and admitting his mistakes, and seeking pardon and revoking of the expulsion, with the assurance that he would not indulge in unfair means and obey all rules and regulations of the university. The members discussed the issue, and it was decided that the appeal of Jatin Yadav should be forwarded to the Hon'ble Chancellor for his consideration. This issue is covered as a separate Agenda Item for the current meeting.

Points Discussed:

- 1. The member secretary informed the members that letter seeking fresh approval for commencing the MA (English) program from the Academic Year 2024-25 has been forwarded to the Director Higher Education, Govt. of Haryana on 28 Feb 2024.
- 2. Mr. Shiv Mehra requested the representative of Director Higher Education Ms Indira Sharma to expedite approval of the same.

The members discussed all the points which were approved in the last Board of Management meeting and ratified the same.

ITEM No. 3: PRESENTATION BY HEAD - DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT & COMMERCE

(Head – M&C Dept.)

Prof. Sona Vikas, Head – Department of Management & Commerce made a presentation on various aspects of the department. Copy of the presentation is enclosed as **Annexure 3**. The presentation covered key areas such as Teaching Learning Process, Academics, Research & Consultancy, Collaborations, Awards & Achievements, Best practices and new initiatives etc.

The following discussions ensued: -

- 1. It was brought out that conduct of the proposed psychometric tests for new admissions is a good idea and needs to be implemented. It was decided that psychometric tests should be administered at the departmental level.
- 2. It was also observed that considering the total faculty strength within the Management and Commerce department, there is scope to increase the number of PhD enrolments, and the current target of 50 was deemed to be low. The Vice Chancellor recommended that a more desirable target would be 68, commensurate with the department's faculty strength holding PhD degree.
- 3. The Pro-Chancellor highlighted the necessity for each faculty member to be assigned a mentor. He also brought out that there should be a structured mechanism to the whole mentoring process, especially with respect to the frequency of the meetings and submission of reports. The Chancellor stated that it should be the responsibility of the faculty to report the minutes / outcomes of the meeting to the HOD on regular intervals. The Chancellor further highlighted that the faculty mentor meetings are meant not only to discuss research related issues, but should serve as an occassion for faculty to delve into various other issues, including but not limited to class discipline, teaching methodologies etc. These meetings should facilitate discussions on diverse aspects of academic and professional development.
- 4. Mr. Shiv Mehra suggested adoption of the 'Management by Objective' principle as the guiding template for all departmental activities. This approach would help the department in setting clear goals and aligning their efforts towards achieving specific, measurable targets, increasing efficiency, and optimization of efforts and resources.
- 5. It was also observed that there is limited impact of the Value-Added Courses currently provided by the department on enhancing students' knowledge. It is imperative for the

- department to reconsider the genesis of these courses, and focus on developing offerings that genuinely add substantial value to the academic and professional growth of the students, and not be a mere replication of topics which are already covered in the regular courses of the programmes. It was highlighted that strategic reassessment and refinement of the existing courses is required to ensure that they align with the contemporary needs of the students and the industries.
- 6. It was brought out by Mr. Shiv Mehra that the current practice of conducting remedial classes may not be optimal, as it tends to foster a lack of seriousness among students. The perception that they can rely on these classes to pass could lead to a complacent attitude. Instead, the effort on part of the faculty should be to ensure effective teaching from the outset, minimizing the need for remedial classes. It was proposed that a thorough reconsideration of the approach to remedial classes is warranted, with a focus on preventive measures through enhanced teaching strategies.
- 7. The Pro Chancellor highlighted that having an external Co-supervisor is a continued practice at NCU and the department can attach external supervisors from reputed Institutions to increase publications and research output. HOD stated that the SOP created is an internal document for communication to the scholars and supervisors, catering to the specific requirements of the department and addressing the specific issues within the department for improving research output. The Pro Chancellor stated that the SOP should be aligned with the existing NCU policy, and if there is any change that is being done, should be in consultation with RDIL, so that if there is a need, it can be implemented across the University.
- 8. The Chancellor enquired as to whether there existed a SOP for interactions of part-time PhD scholars with their Guide/ Supervisors. He stated that individual departments cannot be deciding on such matters independently, and that the SOP should be a pan university procedure, common and applicable to all departments equally. The SOP should lay down a common minimum denominator for all scholars to follow. It was decided that a common SOP be made by RDIL in consultation with all departments, and the revised SOP be presented to the Vice Chancellor for approval, and subsequent implementation by all departments.
- 9. Regarding student admissions in the department, it was shared that in this current Academic Year, the department would like to introduce a Psychometric test for candidate assessment along with a panel interview. The Chancellor brought out that the process should not create stress amongst the candidates, and the Psychometric test should not be for rejection of the candidates, but for overall assessment.
- 10. The Chancellor also brought out that several UG students have a natural flair/ aptitude for academic writing. He suggested that faculty members should identify and tap into the potential of such students and encourage/ involve them in writing papers/ blogs. This would aid tremendously in increasing the numbers and improving the quality of research papers. It would also instil a sense of pride and accomplishment in the UG students to see their names associated with published papers.
- 11. It was also highlighted by the Chancellor that faculty members should be assigned specific targets to acquire necessary certifications before the commencement of each semester. This proactive approach would ensure that they possess the required qualifications and skills relevant to their teaching responsibilities, contributing to the overall enhancement of the academic environment and outcome.
- 12. The Vice Chancellor highlighted the availability of a diverse range of value-added courses offered by the National Stock Exchange that could be beneficial for our

- students. The Chancellor further stated that even if these courses involve a certain fee, it would still be worth it to pursue them.
- 13. Mr. Shiv Mehra highlighted that the department needs to narrow down their scope and vision to concentrate on more concrete and specific areas. He suggested that the department needs a strategic approach involving focused commitment to particular domains, allowing the department to establish expertise and excellence in targeted areas, before considering broader growth initiatives.

The members took note of the issues discussed and urged that actions as decided during the discussions be taken in a time bound manner.

ITEM No. 4: RESTRUCTURING OF SCHOOL OF MANAGEMENT & LIBERAL STUDIES (Member Secretary)

The Member Secretary briefed the members about the restructuring of the School of Management & Liberal Studies and establishment of a Psychology Department under the umbrella of the School of Management & Liberal Studies. He brought out that the restructuring was done with the aim of providing specific impetus and thrust to the Psychology programs of the university. Consequent to the restructuring, the School of Management & Liberal Studies now has three distinct Centres / Departments, as follows (**Annexure 4**):-

- Department of Management & Commerce under HOD Prof. Sona Vikas
- Centre For Language Learning (CLL) under HOD Dr Divyabha Vashisth
- Department of Psychology under Program Chair Dr. Neha Jain

All Members of the Governing Body took note of the above and approved the restructuring of the School of Management and Liberal Studies.

ITEM No. 5: PRESENTATION BY DY. DEAN - RDIL

(Dy. Dean - RDIL)

It was decided during the 38th Governing Body Meeting held on 31st Oct 2023 to have presentations from some key departments of the university in the Governing Body meetings, to apprise the members on important activities of the departments. Accordingly, Dy Dean RDIL made a presentation on his Cell's activities (**Annexure 5**).

The following discussions ensued:

- 1. It was brought out by the Chancellor that the 'year-wise' data on students enrolled in the PhD program, and their respective progress, should be included in the department's presentations. This inclusion would enable a clearer assessment of the time taken for students to complete their PhD studies.
- 2. Mr. Shiv Mehra stated that RDIL should send a monthly status to the HODs, highlighting the deficit in their PhD enrolments vis-a-viz departmental faculty strength

- based on a 4-6-8 ratio for PhD enrolments. A copy of the same should also be shared with the Pro Chancellor and Vice Chancellor.
- 3. The Pro Chancellor highlighted that it is necessary to achieve a quantum jump in PhD admissions and suggested taking up this matter on a 'mission mode'. He observed that unless the number of PhD enrolments increases significantly, the University would continue to lag behind in research publications, citations, h index etc.
- 4. The Chancellor asked as to whether all PhD alumni are there on Almashine. He stated that RDIL should reach out to the high-achieving alumni to gather and showcase their success stories, specifically detailing how their PhD degrees have significantly contributed to the advancement of their careers. This would create a comprehensive and inspiring repository of achievements, demonstrating the tangible value of a PhD from the NorthCap university.
- 5. Dr. Nitin Malik brought out that the PhD program is not fully integrated with the ERP system of the university and challenges are faced in coordinating with other departments because of this. It was suggested that RDIL should take up the difficulties faced in this regard with concerned people, and if need be, with the Vice Chancellor for expeditious resolution.
- 6. Mr Shiv Mehra brought out that the data presented for the total number of students pursuing PhD viz-a-viz number of students a department can enrol based on their faculty strength should be presented 'department wise'. Also, this data needs to be shared with the departments on a monthly basis, with a copy to the Pro Chancellor and Vice Chancellor.
- 7. The Chancellor brought out that there should be a focus on rolling admissions to effectively identify and support highly talented individuals for the Ph.D. programs. The approach should be to promptly recognize and engage bright prospective candidates, streamlining the admissions process to ensure that we attract bright candidates 'throughout' the academic year.
- 8. The issue of Ph.D. supervisors leaving the organization midway through a student's PhD program causing adverse effects on the student was discussed. The PhD regulation already covers comprehensive guidelines clearly outlining relevant policies and procedures in this matter. The guidelines should be reinforced for all supervisors, emphasizing their professional obligations in this regard. It was also suggested that henceforth these guidelines be explicitly mentioned in the appointment letters of new faculty, ensuring their awareness and adherence to the policies and procedures. In the case of existing faculty, a formal communication highlighting the guidelines should be made to the faculty members, and a copy of the same be filed in their respective records for future reference and compliance.
- 9. It was observed by the Vice Chancellor that amongst the list of agencies identified by RDIL for funding of projects, NCU was not eligible for receiving funding from a few agencies for various reasons. It was also brought out that there are several non-governmental agencies from where funds can be sourced relatively easily. RDIL was requested to identify such potential sources from where funding can be obtained. This list of potential funding sources should be regularly shared by RDIL with the faculty for creating awareness among them for funding opportunities. This would ensure that faculty members are well-informed about suitable funding options matched with NCU's eligibility criteria, which would aid in greater participation in research activities. Dr. Zorawar Daulet Singh observed that there is a need for RDIL to enhance its

collaboration and coordination with other departments within the university for a more cohesive and focussed approach in achieving research goals/ targets.

The members took note of the issues discussed and urged that actions as decided during the discussions be taken in a time bound manner.

ITEM No. 6: APPEAL BY JATIN YADAV

(Member Secretary)

The member secretary brought out that Jatin Yadav (20BBA019) was caught using unfair means during the major examinations conducted in December 2023. On examination it emerged that he was a repeat offender and had been caught using unfair means earlier also. Being a repeat offender, he was expelled from the university with effect from 10 Jan 2024. Jatin Yadav filed a plea in response to his expulsion, apologizing and admitting his mistakes, and seeking pardon and revoking of the expulsion, with the assurance that he would not indulge in unfair means and obey all rules and regulations of the university. The Board of Management in its 39th meeting held on 31 Jan 2024 referred the appeal of Jatin Yadav to the Hon'ble Chancellor for his consideration. The Hon'ble Chancellor, post examination of the appeal has taken a compassionate view of the appeal, and approved the following phased response (**Annexure 6**): -

- (i) Jatin Yadav (20BBA019) may be provisionally permitted to register for specific reappear courses under the Supplementary Mode during the current semester, provided that the attendance requirement has been fulfilled.
- (ii) Furthermore, he will be required to enrol in three courses during the Summer Semester under the Regular mode, adhering to NCU norms.
- (iii) Upon successfully completing/ passing the courses mentioned in points (i) and (ii), and demonstrating good behaviour consistent with NCU's standards, he may be granted permission to undertake pending courses in subsequent semesters.

Points Discussed:

It was brought out that the Chancellor accorded approval of a phased and conditional way ahead for the student's continued candidature in the university, as brought out above.

The members of the Governing Body took note of the above and ratified the same. It was agreed that this is being done as a very special case and cannot be cited as a precedent.

ITEM No. 7: UPDATE ON LEGAL MATTERS

(Member Secretary)

The Member Secretary briefed the members about the status of the court cases of the university, as follows:-

Punjab & Haryana High Court Chandigarh

- 1) CWP-22262/2012 Reservation for Haryana Domiciled students and awarding of fee concession. In the matter relating to Reservation for Haryana Domiciled students and awarding of fee concession, the petition has been listed as per the roster. The matter is clubbed with CWP 6229/2013 and is put as a regular matter. The case was listed for hearing on 21 July 2022. Copy of the Interim order is enclosed as Annexure 7. The matter is now with the Supreme Court. The next date of hearing is not yet listed.
- 2) CWP-6229/2013 Regulation of Admission & fixation of fee in Private Universities
 The University has challenged the Haryana Private Technical Education Institutions,
 Regulations of Admission of Fee Act 2012, as this act exercises control over
 admissions and fee through the Fee & Admissions Committee.

The University filed extraordinary writ jurisdiction 13602-13603 dated 07-12-2020, to stay the operation of the Haryana Private Technical Education Institution (Regulation of Admission and Fee) Act, 2012 and memo dated 12-11-2020 and 02-12-2020. This matter is also clubbed with CWP 2644 of 2021.

In 2022 the University had received a Memo No. 365 / A&FRC dated 07.07.2022 regarding the fixation / revision proposal for the Academic Session 2023-24, (enclosed at **Annexure 8**). Since the matter is sub judice, a reply on behalf of the University, by our legal counsel, was made to the Member Secretary of the Admission & Fee Regulatory Committee (copy enclosed at **Annexure 9**).

In 2023 too, the University received a similar Memo from Admission & Fee Regulatory Committee, Haryana (Memo no. 206 / A&FRC), dated: 22.03.2023, regarding schedule of submission of fee fixation / revision proposal for the academic session 2024-25, which is enclosed as **Annexure 10**.

All the details were shared with our Legal counsel, who drafted a suitable reply to the Memo dated 22 March 2023, which was then forwarded to the Admission & Fee Regulatory Committee. Copy of the letter sent is enclosed as **Annexure 11**.

Labour Court Gurugram

3) Following case pertaining to Notice Pay is in progress in the Labour Court, Gurugram. Details of these case is given as under:

a) Mr. Trilok Nath, Ex Technical Staff – Non receipt of Notice Period Pay

The individual is not eligible for notice pay, however gratuity to the individual has been paid. He was informed by Labour Officer Mr. Shushil Maan on 29.09.2020 that he should apply "Maang Patra" against the University if he is not satisfied with the reply. We have now received a letter from the Asst. Labour Commissioner, Circle 2, Gurugram, regarding "Maang Patra". Detailed reply has been submitted to the Labour court on 27-01-2021. University has received a Notice for Appearance & Settlement of Issues from the Court of Mr. Amrit Singh (A.D.J.) Presiding Officer, Tribunal-cum-Labour Court-2, Sharam Shakti Bhawan, Near Mini Sectt., Gurugram and the Hearing

was scheduled on 01.09.2021. The Member Secretary informed that the next date of hearing in the case of Mr. Trilok Nath, Ex Technical Staff is on 15th March 2024.

All Members of the Governing Body took note on the progress of the legal matters of the University.

ITEM No. 8: REPORTING MATTERS / INFORMATION POINTS

(Member Secretary)

1. Life Fellowship Award to Prof. Prem Vrat

The member secretary brought out that the NCU fraternity is delighted to share the remarkable achievement of our esteemed Pro-Chancellor, Professor of Eminence, and Chief Mentor, Prof. Prem Vrat, who has been honoured with the prestigious 'Life Fellow Award' by the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kharagpur on 18 December 2023. Prof. Prem Vrat's dedication to education, innovation, and excellence has been an inspiration to all of us at The NorthCap University. The 'Life Fellow Award' bestowed upon Prof. Prem Vrat reflects his unwavering commitment to academic excellence and his tireless efforts to push the boundaries of knowledge. It serves as a reminder of the high standards and values that he has instilled in all of us. We are immensely proud to have him as a guiding force at our institution. We extend our heartfelt congratulations to Prof. Prem Vrat on this well-deserved honour.

2. Lifetime Teaching Achievement Award

The member secretary also informed the members that Prof. Manjula Batra was conferred with the Lifetime Teaching Achievement Award by the All India Law Teachers Congress on 17th December 2023. Honourable Mr Justice Swatanter Kumar, former Judge of the Supreme Court of India and former Chairperson of the National Green Tribunal presented the award. We are proud to have such a dedicated and talented professor shaping the next generation of legal leaders at our university.

3. Signing of MoU's

(a) MoU with Loyola Marymount University, USA

An MoU with Loyola Marymount University (LMU), USA has been signed on 08 Feb 2024. LMU. Loyola Marymount University (LMU) is a private Jesuit and Marymount research university in Los Angeles, California. LMU is the parent school to Loyola Law School and offers 55 major and 59 minor undergraduate degrees and programs across six undergraduate colleges. The Graduate Division offers 47 master's degree programs, one education doctorate, one doctorate in juridical science, a Juris Doctor and 13 credential programs. The scope of the agreement includes: -

- i. Exchange information and experience regarding educational exchange programs and make cooperative efforts to promote such educational exchange programs.
- ii. Explore joint degree/ dual degree pathways.
- iii. Research collaboration between faculty and short-term exchange of faculty members.
- iv. Organize student exchange programs.

v. Organize joint seminars and competitions for students.

(b) MOU with the Haryana Space Applications Centre (HARSAC)

NCU signed an MOU with the Haryana Space Applications Centre (HARSAC) on 22 November 2023. The MoU was signed by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Prof. Nupur Prakash and Mr. Anup Kumar, Principal Scientist from HARSAC. The MoU marks a significant collaboration for fostering academic and scientific cooperation in the field of space applications and related research. This MoU outlines a framework for collaboration in various areas, including Research and Development (R&D), Academic Exchange Programmes, Training & Workshops and Infrastructure and Resource Sharing. The NorthCap University is the first private university in Haryana to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with HARSAC.

(c) MOU with MongoDB Software India Pvt Ltd (MongoDB).

NCU signed an MOU with MongoDB Software India Pvt. Ltd. on 11 Jan 2024 for collaborating on enhancing the education of students on MongoDB and NoSQL/non-relational databases. The collaboration is to explore the running of program planned by MongoDB for the needs of the NorthCap University.

(d) MOU with Airbotix Technology Pvt Ltd.

NCU signed an MOU with Airbotix Technology Pvt Ltd on 01 Nov 2023 to set up an Industry – Academia partnership dedicated to supporting Research and Development in the field of unmanned vehicle technology. Under the MOU, Airbotix will support NCU in mentoring faculty and students for R&D activities on Drones and other associated technologies.

4. Extension / renewal of contract granted to Prof. Swaran Ahuja, Advisor – Academic Affairs.

Prof. Swaran Ahuja, erstwhile HOD EECE and Dean Academics, currently Advisor – Academic Affairs, is employed on a contractual basis with the university, which has got renewed till 31 December 2024 exclusively for academic activities. The appointment being held by him is a non-statutory post. The Board of Management in its 39th meeting held on 31 Jan 2024 ratified the extension granted to Prof. Swaran Ahuja.

5. Meeting of the Academic Council

The 33rd Academic Council meeting was held on 25 Jan 2024 in the campus. Minutes of the meeting are enclosed as **Annexure 12**.

6. Meeting of the Academic Council Standing Committee

The Standing committee of the Academic Council met on 10 Nov 2023. The minutes of the meeting are enclosed as **Annexure 13**.

7. Strategic implementation of blended teaching-learning

The NorthCap University Gurugram has consistently demonstrated its commitment to innovative teaching and learning methods, continually striving for educational excellence. In alignment with this commitment, NCU has meticulously crafted a comprehensive plan to seamlessly integrate online teaching into on-campus programmes. This initiative spans across all three schools; SOET, SOM & LS, and

SOL, and has evolved through extensive discussions among stakeholders at all levels. The action plan centre's around adopting blended courses (First-Year Courses: Faceto-face delivery for all first year UG courses, with up to 50% blended mode in PG programs. Second-Year Courses: 10% blended mode for UG (except law), up to 50% in PG with MOOC options. Third and Fourth-Year Courses: Minimum 15% MOOC mode in UG (except law programs) and PG programs). Practice Sessions for Blended courses retain the face-to-face approach, evaluated by the university. Equivalent external courses from reputed MOOC platforms have been identified to complement NCU courses in a blended mode. The Evaluation Process would comprise of university-conducted summative evaluations (Minor and major tests). Faculty assignments based on enrolment to maintain a reasonable student-to-faculty ratio, ensuring effective and quality evaluations aligned with NCU standards has been ensured. Detailed guidelines have been framed and quality assured through adherence to best practices for evaluations with regular compliance reports. Blended mode reduces face-to-face lecture commitments, allowing faculty to focus on research. Advanced learners can opt for up to 40% of total credits in Full MOOC Mode.

8. Convocation Ceremony – 15 December 2023

NCU, held its 12th Annual Convocation Ceremony for its various undergraduate and postgraduate programmes on 15 December 2023. The Chief Guest at the function was Prof. T. G. Sitharam, Chairman, AICTE. A total of 734 students were awarded degrees in their respective disciplines, including 429 from BTech, 4 from BSc Maths (H), 04 from BSc Data Science (H), 07 from BSc Chemistry (H), 07 from BSc Physics (H), 37 from BCom (H), 13 from BA Economic (H), 16 from BA Psychology (H), 87 from BBA, 64 from BBA-LLB (H), 11 from MTech, 28 from MBA, 9 from LLM and 18 awarded PhD. Gold, Silver and Bronze medals were awarded to 28 candidates who were top performers in their respective streams.

9. HR Conclave 2023

Centre of Professional Attachment & Alumni Engagement (CPAA) organized 'HR Conclave 2023' at The NorthCap University on November 23rd – 24th, 2023. The theme was "Shaping the Future Workforce and Re-imagining Tomorrow's Workplace." The event brought together eminent HR professionals from the industry on a common platform where they shared their experiences and best practices on the topic "Hiring trends of corporate for campus." HR professionals interacted with the faculty and students from the engineering, management, and law disciplines. 388 students participated in the Conclave.

11. Visit of delegates from Moscow State University, Russia.

12. Financial Support – Department of Science & Technology (DST)

MDE Dept

The project titled "Early Prediction and Evaluation of Sepsis using Machine Learning" has been recommended for financial support of Rs 26 Lakhs for a period of 3 years from the Department of Science & Technology (DST). The Principal Investigator (PI) for this project is Ms. Shraddha Kumar, a Research Scholar in the MDE Department. The Mentor for the project is Dr. Pooja Sabherwal.

APS Dept

- 1. Two new research projects from the APS Department got the sanction of the Government agency (DST-SERB), as follows: -
 - (i) Project Title: Designing of various hybrid structure phase masks for optical image encryption for information security using certain selected mathematical transforms. Grant amount: 33.12 Lakh, Duration: 3 Years. Principal Investigator Prof. Hukum Singh. Agency: DST-SERB (Core Research Grant).
 - (ii) Project Title: Development of air-stable perovskite semiconductor-based field-effect phototransistor with a high response speed. Grant amount: 16.8 Lakh, Duration: 3 Years, (Principal Investigator Dr. Arjun Singh. Agency: DST-SERB (TARE).

13. Celebration of 75th Republic Day

The University celebrated the 75th Republic Day on 26 January 2024 with fervor and gaiety, during which the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof. Nupur Prakash unfurled the National flag honouring the spirit of unity and patriotism. In her address to the faculty and staff, she spoke about the importance of education in shaping the future of our country, and the significant steps taken by NCU to keep pace with technological, social and legal requirements of modern society, and in equipping our students to face the challenges therein.

14. Stride International Conference 2023.

This hybrid event held on $14^{th}-15^{th}$ December 2023, aimed to unravel the intricate connections between Sustainability, Technology, Resilience, Innovation, Development and Entrepreneurship, with a global perspective on addressing contemporary challenges.

15. National-level IC HACK 2.0

A team of NCU students, Vishal Jain, Lakshay Yadav, Utkarsh Singh and Satyawan Yadav emerged as the champions in the national-level IC HACK 2.0 event at Manipal University, Jaipur, organised by IEEE India Council, outperforming 300+ teams. 16. Winner Trophy for the Exemplary Performance (EP) Award under the 'Existing Buildings' category at 15th GRIHA Council Summit

The NorthCap University, Gurugram has been conferred with a 'Winner Trophy' for the Exemplary Performance (EP) Award under the 'Existing Buildings' category during the 15th GRIHA Council Summit with the theme "Empowering Sustainable and Resilient Communities" on 24th November 2023. This honour recognises NCU's efforts to have met sustainability goals and acknowledges the university's commitment to the cause of sustainable development.

18. The NorthCap University, Trademark Registration

Consequent to our collaboration with Arizona State University (ASU) a new logo was prepared and sent to The Registrar of Trademark, Delhi. The Registrar of Trademark, Delhi had raised some objections, which were answered by our Advocate who has filed the Trademark application. The case came up for hearing on 08 January 2024, but got postponed on the morning of 08 January 2024 due to administrative reasons. The case finally came up for hearing on 22 Feb 2024 (**Annexure 14**), wherein the Registrar of Trademark accepted the explanation of our Advocate to the objections raised. The trademark application shall now be advertised in the next issue of the Trade Marks Journal, and in case no third party opposes the registration of the mark within 04 months of such advertisement in the journal, the mark will proceed for registration.

The Finance committee related matters discussed and approved during the last Finance Committee meetings were updated to the members, and the Minutes of the Finance Committee meetings held on 17 Oct 2023 & 18 Jan 2024 are enclosed as **Annexure 15 & 16.**

All members of Governing Body took note of the above and ratified the aforesaid Finance Committee related matters.

ITEM No 10: ANY OTHER MATTER WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE CHAIRMAN.

The Chairman brought to the notice of the Governing Body some of the problematic issues which NCU has been facing with the Cintana Alliance.

He brought out that post the Covid period, based on the prevailing situation, the digitisation and internationalisation in the education sector was considered a focus area and a desirable aspect to pursue. Accordingly, NCU identified a global player M/s Cintana Alliance to explore collaboration opportunities with other universities worldwide. The Chairman brought out that the collaboration with Cintana Alliance however has not lived up to its intended outcomes, and has not yielded the desired results. The Chairman brought out that in particular, two significant obligations of the contract have fallen well short of the promised delivery. These pertain to non-appointment of two secondees on a regular basis, and the breach of exclusivity clause (Clause 2.8 of the License Agreement of February 2021, signed between The NorthCap University (NCU) Gurugram and the Arizona Board of Regents, a body corporate, for and on behalf of Arizona State University (ASU), whereby ASU has granted certain rights in terms of ASU Educational Assets and Contents in the 'territory' of Haryana and NCR as defined in the agreement). ASU is a member university of the Cintana Alliance. Despite repeatedly taking up the issue of breach of exclusivity rights of NCU under the NCU-ASU agreement with Cintana, no significant steps have been taken by Cintana to address the concerns raised by NCU. In short, the Chairman brought out that Cintana has overpromised and underdelivered on its obligations. The Chairman stated that significant financial outflow is incurred in the agreement with Cintana Alliance without commensurate gain, and hence there is a need to reconsider continuation of the collaboration with Cintana, in new avtar, if at all.

All members of the Governing Body took note of the above and concurred with the views expressed by the Chairman.

There being no other points, the meeting concluded with the Member Secretary thanking everyone for sparing their valuable time and participating in the meeting.

After assuming the chair as Chairman, Mr. Avdhesh Mishra thanked his predecessor for his able steering of the University and its growth and development under his stewardship.

The Chairman thanked the Vice Chancellor for her kind words and requested the Member Secretary to commence with the agenda of the day.

The Member Secretary welcomed all members to the XXXVIII meeting of the Governing Body, and informed that the XXXVII meeting of the Governing Body was held on 31st May 2023.

(Member Secretary)

A. APPOINTMENT OF MR. AVDHESH MISHRA AS CHANCELLOR OF THE NORTHCAP UNIVERSITY.

(Member Secretary)

The appointment of Mr Avdhesh Mishra as Chancellor of the university by the Governor of Haryana with effect from 03 August 2023 was taken on record by the members of the Governing Body.

The member secretary informed that as a result of the appointment of Mr Avdhesh Mishra as Chancellor of the university with effect from 03 Aug 2023, changes became necessary to the composition of the Governing Body, Board of Management and Finance Committee, which were approved by the Board of Management in the 38th Board of Management meeting held on 29th August 2023, and notified vide the minutes of the meeting promulgated on 05 Sep 2023. The member secretary brought out that subsequently however, few more changes were necessitated due to fresh appointments/ resignations in the Governing Body and Finance Committee of the University. Accordingly, the revised composition of the Governing Body, Board of Management and Finance Committee was included in the agenda for the 38th meeting of the Governing Body forwarded by email on 16 Oct 2023, and reproduced as under:

The revised composition of the Governing Body, Board of Management and Finance Committee as specified above was approved by the Governing Body.

B. ADMISSION UPDATE FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2023-24.

The member secretary informed that an update on the admissions for the Academic Year 2023-24 was presented during the 38th Board of Management meeting held on 29th August 2023 by the Head Admissions. The UGC had intimated that the last date of admission for the current academic year is 30th September 2023 (with full fee refund) and 31st October 2023 (after deducting Rs. 1000/- and refunding balance fee).

The following points were relevant with regards admissions/ intake:

- The issue of low admissions in BCA this year, as compared to last year, was a cause of concern. It was brought out that since the subject of Maths was made compulsory at +2 level as eligibility criteria for BCA this year, the enrolments have dropped.
- The strict selection criteria, Interview & screening process to be continued and quality
 of students to be checked during admissions through a two level approach viz at the
 level of admission office to begin with, and then at the departmental level through a
 panel of faculty constituted for this purpose.
- Students seeking withdrawal are writing directly to the UGC without informing the
 University, and the UGC in turn is asking the university to immediately refund the fee.
 A suitable communication needs to be sent to UGC in this regard that we have not
 refused refund to anyone. The member secretary informed that this action has been
 completed.
- The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor suggested that UI/ UX specialisation should be introduced in BCA from next year onwards to increase enrolments.

- Dean Academics brought out that there is a need to re-examine the large number of specializations that are being offered in various programmes, as the same leads to situations wherein a particular specialization has very few admissions, which in turn has associated administrative and academic repercussions. He suggested that the university should offer generic programmes, and specializations therein can be incorporated later at an appropriate stage. Mr. Mehra requested the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to review the programmes in line with the NEP 2020 to incorporate flexibility and a liberal approach in the matter.
- MA (English) and MA (Psychology) courses to be kept on hold as of now, and to be reviewed next year.

C. ANALYSIS OF SEMESTER RESULT JANUARY - JUNE 2023

Dy. Dean Examination presented a comprehensive analysis of semester results January – June 2023 session, for all schools during the meeting.

D. UPDATE ON INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS OFFICE (IRO)

A presentation was made in the 38th Board of Management meeting held on 29th August 2023 by the Dy. Dean International Affairs, who updated the members on the recent initiatives of the International Relations Office. She highlighted the immersion programmes undertaken at the Arizona State University, USA, SIT Japan and Univ. of Isa Ungul, Indonesia, where students of NCU participated. She also informed the members about a forthcoming immersion program in December 2023, wherein students of the University of North Florida (UNF) will be visiting NCU.

It was decided that Immersion programmes at NCU need to be planned with other universities as well. In this regard, Dr. Sharda in consultation with Dr. Manoj Gopaliya, was requested to present a suitable plan of action by 10th December 2023. It was also discussed that a booklet should to prepared, which should bring out all the international partnerships in a tabular form, and also indicate the number of students who expressed interest in various immersion programmes, and those who finally ended up attending them. It was further decided that a FAQ for International Relations Office should be brought out, in hard print.

E. CHANGES TO FEE STRUCTURE:

The member secretary brought out that the proposed changes in fee structure and intakes to various programmes for the Academic Year 2023-24 were discussed and approved in the 38th Board of Management meeting held on 29th August 2023. It was brought out that the Fee reduction and Intake revision was undertaken to encourage more students to join the university, whilst simultaneously ensuring enrolment of good quality students.

F. CREATION OF CENTRE FOR MEDIA AND ENTERTAINMENT (CME)

The member secretary informed that members that the creation of the 'Centre for Media and Entertainment' was discussed and approved in the 38th Board of Management meeting held on 29th August 2023. Head CSE had briefed the members on the functioning and responsibilities of the CME. She also briefed the members about the infrastructure, academic team, software's available and the placement opportunities for students pursuing courses in media and entertainment.

G. DISCIPLINARY CASE - EXPULSION FROM UNIVERSITY

The member secretary brought out that one student 21LLB074 Dhruv was involved in adopting unfair means during his major examination on 11 May 2023. Upon examination of the case, it was observed that he had earlier also resorted to cheating during exams. Being a repeat offender, the student was expelled from the University on 19 June 2023. It was brought out that due process, as per university rules and regulations, had been followed in the examination and disposal of the case.

H. REPEATED BREACH OF EXCLUSIVITY OF USE OF ASU LOGO/ MARKS IN THE 'TERRITORY'.

The member secretary informed the members that there have been recurrent instances in the recent past of advertisements in newspapers by private universities located in Gurugram, which have featured the ASU Logo/ Mark in their advt., which is a breach of the exclusivity rights of NCU under the NCU – ASU License Agreement of February 2021. A five-member committee was constituted to examine the issues pertaining to the breach of exclusivity rights over use of ASU Logo/ Marks by other universities in the 'Territory' in terms of the License Agreement between NCU and ASU, and what needs to be done to stop these occurrences. The Committee submitted its report on 18 September 2023 and the same is under active consideration with regards next course of action in this matter.

On the issue of breach of exclusivity rights of NCU under the NCU-ASU License Agreement in 'the territory', it was decided that the matter be referred to the legal counsel of the university for examination and legal opinion on the way ahead.

I. 'NON-APPROVAL' OF NEW PROGRAMMES

The issue of 'non approval' of new programmes by the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Haryana was discussed during the 38th Board of Management meeting held on 29 Aug 2023. It was decided that the issue needs to be taken up with the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Haryana, yet again. Firstly, why is it that Private Universities of Haryana need to take approval of the State Govt. for commencing new programmes. Is this applicable to State Public universities as well. If not, then it is discriminatory in nature, given that the private universities are also UGC approved, and therefore have been assessed to be capable of offering degrees in chosen programmes, and hence should have the freedom to run programmes of their choice, based on market requirements and other factors as may have been assessed by them. The present stance of the Govt. of Haryana runs contrary to the basic tenets of NEP 2020. Secondly, in case a particular program(s) has not been approved by the State Government, then reasons for the same should be provided to the university, so that shortcomings if any can be addressed and overcome by the university. Simply stating not approved is not acceptable.

J. RESERVATION IN ADMISSION AND FEE CONCESSION

Reservation in Admission and Fee Concession as per provisions of Section 36 of Haryana Private University Act 32 of 2006 (as amended upto 10 May 2012). The university has been pursuing this matter with the DHE, Govt of Haryana vide several letters, but no reply has been received from the dept. The member secretary brought out that a total of 23 letters have been written to the DHE, requesting for different percentage of students eligible for hundred per cent, fifty percent or twenty-five per cent fee concession [in terms of Section 36 of Haryana Private University Act 32 of 2006 (as amended upto 10 May 2012)], given that The NorthCap University has collaborations/ MOUs with several foreign/ international universities.

It was decided that another reminder letter should be sent to DHE for the same, enclosing the newly made Brochure of International Relations Office, which contains updated details of all collaborations with different reputed foreign universities. The DHE is requested to examine the issue on priority and allow a different percentage of students eligible for hundred per cent, fifty percent or twenty-five per cent fee concession to The NorthCap University, as done for some other private universities of Haryana having collaborations with foreign universities.

The following points were discussed:

- 1. Mr. Mehra stated that the changes made to the student intake and fee structure for the Academic year 2023-24 in August 2023 be informed to the Directorate of Higher Education, Government of Haryana on or before 20th November 2023.
- 2. It was discussed that in case no response is received from DHE Haryana on the proposals of the university for starting new programs within the stipulated period of 120 days, the proposals should be deemed to be approved in accordance with Section 34(A) of the Haryana Private University Act No 16 of 2012.

The members discussed in detail all the points which were approved in the last Board of Management meeting and ratified the same.

ITEM No. 3: PRESENTATION BY HEAD - COMPUTER SCIENCE ENGINEERING (CSE) (Head - CSE)

Dr. Rita Chhikara, Head – School of Engineering & Technology (SOET) made a presentation on various aspects of the School. Copy of the presentation is enclosed as **Annexure 2**. The presentation covered key areas such as Teaching Learning Process, Academics, Research & Consultancy, Collaborations, Awards & Achievements, Extension Activities, challenges, and future plans. Dr. Chhikara highlighted the faculty and student ratio of the department, the number of MOOC courses, full time and blended MOOC courses etc. Dr. Chhikara also emphasised on the requirement of recruiting additional full-time faculty in the department.

She also presented the research initiatives taken up by the department in improving research publications, and covered some important events conducted by the department viz. Workshop on ORACLE- APEX TECHNOLOGY, MoU signed with the Volkswagen Group, ICT Academy, internships, and industrial visits. The department also conducted the IEEE Return Mothers Conference on 26th and 27th October 2023 with 200+ participants, including international speakers. The members appreciated the efforts taken in organizing the IEEE Returning Mothers conference at international level.

The following discussions ensued:

- 1. Hon'ble Chancellor whilst appreciating the presentation made by Dr Rita Chhikara, HOD (CSE), emphasised the need of improving the number of Ph.D. enrolments and research publications.
- 2. Members of the Governing Body conveyed their concern regarding the department's relatively low publication output, and urged the department to engage in a thorough self-assessment to identify and foster a more focused approach to academic publications. Dr Chhikara raised the matter of securing financial assistance for participation in conferences and similar events.
- 3. Members of the Governing Body emphasized the importance of establishing a Committee to look into financial assistance required for attending Conferences/ Workshops etc., to formulate a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for the same. The Governing Body was of the view that it is imperative to institute departmentspecific financial assistance limits for participating in conferences, workshops, and related activities.
- 4. The Hon'ble Chancellor also conveyed that Faculty within the Department of Computer Science and Engineering, who are inherently self-driven and self-motivated, should be granted the means and incentive to excel further. To this end, the Hon'ble Chancellor recommended that Dr. Chhikara undertake the preparation of a distinct proposal outlining the financial requisites for facilitating publication of research papers in paid open access journals.
- 5. The members of the Governing Body also conveyed their concerns regarding the department's low Ph.D. enrolments. They stated that each Ph.D. faculty member should supervise a minimum of five Ph.D. students, and this should be made a quantifiable parameter in the annual appraisal of the concerned faculties.
- 6. Members of the Governing Body also put forth the suggestion that the department should prioritize Ph.D. programs for 'industry experts and working professionals' occupying senior positions within their respective domains. This would be a win-win situation for all, as the additional qualification would boost the professional profile of the industry experts, and the university would benefit from additional PhD scholars, and in turn, enhanced research in the university.
- 7. The Governing Body had a recommendation to streamline the Ph.D. registration procedure, emphasizing the reduction of administrative paperwork. Additionally, it was proposed that a more straightforward and subjective assessment be devised to cater to working professionals. These could be more aligned to their respective line of work, rather than hard core generic theory.

- 8. The Governing Body whilst appreciating the Summer Certification courses designed for students who were unable to pursue internships, opined that industry experts could be included in these programs to provide students with valuable and niche exposure. Furthermore, there was also a suggestion to integrate these skill programs and certifications into the formal curriculum. The members of the Governing Body stressed the significance of the students distinguishing themselves to secure favourable placement opportunities through acquiring additional certifications relevant to the job market.
- 9. Regarding CSE faculty who are non PhD's, the Hon'ble Chancellor directed that the status of such faculty vis-à-vis timelines indicated to them to complete their respective PhD's be ascertained by the HOD, and where required, a suitable communication be made to them by HR for expediting the same.
- 10. With regards analysis of the low placement figures of recent batches, it was felt that a structured feedback system needs to be formulated with a methodical approach. The following points should be considered while doing so:
 - a. A meticulously organized calendar defining the specific occasions and timeframes during which feedback is to be solicited and received.
 - b. Preparation of templates for feedback forms, ensuring their preparedness well in advance of their required use.
 - c. Outcome based questions to be included in the questionnaire to have constructive feedback.

The members took note of the issues discussed and urged that actions as decided during the discussions be taken in a time bound manner.

ITEM NO 4: DISCIPLINARY CASE - TERMINATION OF SERVICES OF AN EMPLOYEE AND SUSPENTION OF A STUDENT FOR ONE ACADEMIC YEAR

(Member Secretary)

The member secretary informed the members that the following disciplinary actions have been taken in the university pertaining to a single event (case) involving an employee of the university and a student. The incident pertained to an allegation of demanding of bribe by a university employee (Mr Ram Upadhyay) of the Dean Academics office, from a student (22BBA134, Kartik Yadav), for favours in return, and, payment of bribe money by the student to the employee. The below mentioned actions were taken after following the due process and laid down norms and practices for handling such matters in the university:-

(a) Termination of Services of Mr Ram Upadhyay. Based on the findings and recommendations of the Fact Finding Committee constituted to examine the allegations made by the student, the services of Mr Ram Upadhyay were terminated with effect from 14 September 2023 on grounds of grave misconduct by an employee of the university (Annexure 3)

(b) Based on the findings and recommendations of the above referred Fact Finding Committee, the student 22BBA134 Kartik Yadav was suspended from the University for one Academic Year with effect from 19 Sep 2023 vide the University letter NCU/DISC/09-02/2023 dated 19 Sep 2023 (**Annexure 4**), on charges of paying bribe to a university employee for favors in return. The student has appealed against the suspension on 23 Sep 2023, and the matter is under examination by the Higher Committee of the University.

The members of the Governing Body took note of the above and ratified the same.

ITEM No. 5: UPDATE ON LEGAL MATTERS

(Member Secretary)

The Member Secretary briefed the members about the status of the court cases of the university, as follows:-

Punjab & Haryana High Court Chandigarh

- 1) CWP-22262/2012 Reservation for Haryana Domiciled students and awarding of fee concession. In the matter relating to Reservation for Haryana Domiciled students and awarding of fee concession, the petition has been listed as per the roster. The matter is clubbed with CWP 6229/2013 and is put as a regular matter. The case was listed for hearing on 21 July 2022. Copy of the Interim order is enclosed as Annexure 5. The matter is now with the Supreme Court. The next date of hearing is not yet listed.
- 2) CWP-6229/2013 Regulation of Admission & fixation of fee in Private Universities The University has challenged the Haryana Private Technical Education Institutions, Regulations of Admission of Fee Act 2012, as this act exercises control over admissions and fee through the Fee & Admissions Committee.

The University filed extraordinary writ jurisdiction 13602-13603 dated 07-12-2020, to stay the operation of the Haryana Private Technical Education Institution (Regulation of Admission and Fee) Act, 2012 and memo dated 12-11-2020 and 02-12-2020. This matter is also clubbed with CWP 2644 of 2021.

Last year the University had received a Memo No. 365 / A&FRC dated 07.07.2022 regarding the fixation / revision proposal for the Academic Session 2023-24, (enclosed at **Annexure 6**). Since the matter is sub judice, a reply on behalf of the University, by our legal counsel, was made to the Member Secretary of the Admission & Fee Regulatory Committee (copy enclosed at **Annexure 7**).

This year too, the University has received a similar Memo from Admission & Fee Regulatory Committee, Haryana (Memo no. 206 / A&FRC), dated: 22.03.2023, regarding schedule of submission of fee fixation / revision proposal for the academic session 2024-25, which is enclosed as **Annexure 8**.

All the details were shared with our Legal counsel, who drafted a suitable reply to the Memo dated 22 March 2023, which was then forwarded to the Admission & Fee Regulatory Committee. Copy of the letter sent is enclosed as **Annexure 9**.

Labour Court Gurugram

3) Following case pertaining to Notice Pay is in progress in the Labour Court, Gurugram. Details of these case is given as under:

a) Mr. Trilok Nath, Ex Technical Staff - Non receipt of Notice Period Pay

The individual is not eligible for notice pay, however gratuity to the individual has been paid. He was informed by Labour Officer Mr. Shushil Maan on 29.09.2020 that he should apply "Maang Patra" against the University if he is not satisfied with the reply. We have now received a letter from the Asst. Labour Commissioner, Circle 2, Gurugram, regarding "Maang Patra". Detailed reply has been submitted to the Labour court on 27-01-2021. University has received a Notice for Appearance & Settlement of Issues from the Court of Mr. Amrit Singh (A.D.J.) Presiding Officer, Tribunal-cum-Labour Court-2, Sharam Shakti Bhawan, Near Mini Sectt., Gurugram and the Hearing was scheduled on 01.09.2021. The next date of hearing is awaited.

Members of the Governing Body took note of the progress in the various legal cases of the University.

1. JSB Minutes

NCU and Cintana Education LLC, USA signed an agreement on January 23, 2021, to boost NCU's brand through domestic growth, online expansion, and new programs, leveraging ASU's expertise. To monitor progress of work under the agreement, a Joint Strategic Board (JSB) was formed, which meets periodically for the said purpose. It has been decided to include the minutes of the JSB meetings in the Board of Management and Governing Body meetings of the University from now onwards. The members also discussed the violation of NCU's exclusivity rights by competing universities in Gurugram/Haryana, misusing ASU Logo/Marks in admission ads, a clear breach of the NCU-ASU License Agreement from February 2021. NCU informed Cintana that an expert committee has been constituted in the University to examine instances of breach of exclusivity rights of The NorthCap University (NCU) under the NCU-ASU License Agreement of February 2021, and propose further way ahead.

2. QS-IGauge awards

The NorthCap University proudly received the Diamond Badge in the Overall Category and the Platinum Badge in the Engineering Category at the QS I·GAUGE awards. Prof. Rekha Vig, Professor & Dy. ITEM NO. 7: FINANCE COMMITTEE RELATED MATTERS

(Member Secretary)

The Finance committee related matters discussed and approved during the last Finance Committee meeting were updated to the members, and the Minutes of the Finance Committee meeting held on 17 August 2023 is enclosed as **Annexure 11**.

The Members of Governing Body ratified the aforesaid Finance Committee related matters.

ITEM No 8: ANY OTHER MATTER WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE CHAIRMAN.

ISSUE 1. PROPOSED SALARY REVISION FOR ASSISTANT PROFESSOR-PHDS ONLY – The member secretary informed that in July 2023, the University Grants Commission (UGC) has revised its guidelines via notification stating that PhD qualification would be optional for appointment as an Assistant Professor. In view of this, in order to retain and reward experienced existing PhD faculty in the Assistant Professor grade (Induction and Senior Scale) of all Schools, a one-time fitment is proposed for PhD faculty already working in the University in the Assistant Professor grade, giving weightage to their PhD and experience: both prior to and while at NCU. (Increment Rate: 2.25% (75% weightage) for experience prior to NCU, and 3% for experience at NCU). The pre-condition however would be that no faculty should have any adverse or negative feedback on their track record in order to be considered for the above fitment. The HR Note to be taken on record for approval of the Governing Body is placed at **Annexure 12**.

ISSUE 2. PROPOSED AUDIT OF PRIVATE UNIVERSITIES OF HARYANA BY QUALITY COUNCIL OF INDIA. With reference to the Memo received from the Directorate of Higher Education (Annexure 13) regarding conduct of Audit of Private Universities (Academic, Financial and Administrative audits) by the Quality Council of India, the matter was discussed by the Governing Body, and it was opined that the university is already undergoing several audits by appropriate bodies (regulatory as well as Govt nominated) to assess its financial, academic and administrative practices, and therefore an additional audit by the Quality Council of India would be a repetition of efforts and consume valuable time of all stakeholders. It was therefore decided that a letter be made to the Department of Higher Education, Government of Haryana, bringing out the above facts, and requesting for review of the decision to do audit of the university by the Quality Council of India.

Other General Observations:

- Prof. Prem Vrat held the view that it is imperative for key personnel to participate in Governing Body Meetings and give a brief, 5-7 minutes presentation to provide an overview of the activities within their respective departments. In this regard he felt that there should be presentations from CPAA and RDIL in every Governing Body meeting, being two key functionaries of the university, whose performance and outcomes need to be monitored as they have a major bearing on how the university is performing. The Hon'ble Chancellor directed that in line with the observation of the Pro Chancellor, CPAA and RDIL to henceforth give presentation in forthcoming meetings of the Governing Body with regards their activities, initiatives and results. He further directed that presentations of 5 min by other key functionaries can also be included, as considered relevant, for the benefit of members of the Governing Body for necessary information and discussions.
- CPAA to share the students' feedback received from the industry with all the departments.

- With regards monitoring of court cases of the university, it was suggested that SOL faculty should see the Cause List of Supreme Court to monitor and keep tab of the same.
- Mr. Shiv Mehra requested that the minutes of all JSB meetings held thus far to be included in the minutes of the 38th Governing Body meeting, and, continued thereafter as a standard practice. The same are placed at **Annexure 14**.
- Exit interviews to be conducted by HR and key observations on reasons for leaving be identified and shown against each name, for information of the members of the Governing Body. Action by: HR.
- Members unanimously requested the Government nominee on the Governing Body to kindly take up all our long pending issues with the Government including but not limited to Scholarships & Fee Concession, matter relating to audit and issue of Parity between Government and Private Universities regulated by UGC.
- Withdrawal of Mr. Sachin Jain as Cintana rep. was taken on record, and it was informed that he has been replaced by Mr. Chaitanya Chitta as the Cintana rep. on the Governing Body. It was also informed that Ms. Malini Eliatamby has nominated by Cintana as their representative on the Board of Management of the NorthCap University. The Registrar was requested to issue letters to both.
- VC Office to provide the list of Vice Chancellors in NCR / Northern India.
 - A list of letters/ correspondence normally sent from the VC's Office to other Vice Chancellors to be shared with the Governing Body, for info.
 - o The recent IRO booklet to be circulated to all key offices in the university.
 - VC Office / Registrar Office should have at least 10 copies of such booklets / publications for records, and potential future use.
- A reminder be made to ASU/ Cintana to forward a copy of the ASU-Cintana Agreement as the auditors and the GST consultant need the same urgently to process their next bill. Mr. Chaitanya Chitta was requested to do the needful without delay.

There being no other points, the meeting concluded with the Member Secretary thanking everyone for sparing their valuable time and participating in the meeting.


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







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


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














NCRC International Student Case Study

- 3. Appeal of the student is attached as **Annexure-1**.
- 4. The recommendations of the UMC Committee on the appeal are outlined as follows:
 - a. Mr. Jatin (20BBA019) may be provisionally permitted to register for specific reappear courses under the Supplementary Mode during the current semester, provided that the attendance requirement has already been fulfilled.
 - b. Furthermore, he will be required to enroll in three courses during the Summer Semester under the Regular mode, adhering to NCU norms.
 - c. Upon successfully completing/passing the courses mentioned in Points (a) and (b), and demonstrating good behavior consistent with NCU's standards, he may be granted permission to undertake pending courses in subsequent semesters.

Sir,

We are in receipt of your memo dated 07.07.2022 wherein it has been informed that fresh dates for submitting fee fixation/ revision proposal for academic session 2023- 2024 for technical courses has been fixed. It appears that the said memo has been issued under the Haryana Private Technical Education Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Fee) Act, 2022.

At the outset, we bring to your kind attention that the virus of the Haryana Private Technical Education Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Fee) Act, 2022 has been challenged in Civil Writ Petition No. 6229 of 2013 titled 'Educate India Society & Anr. vs. State of Haryana & Ors.' before the Hon'ble High Court for the State of Punjab and Haryana. We also bring to your kind attention that vide order dated 06.12.2013 in Civil Writ Petition No. 19393 of 2013 titled 'B.S. Anangpuria Charitable Trust & Ors. vs. State of Haryana & Ors.', the Hon'ble High Court was pleased to restrain the Government of Haryana to not give effect to any decision under the 2012 Act without the leave of the Hon'ble Court, the said order was again repeated in Civil Writ Petition No. 6229 of 2013 on 30.06.2021, when memo similar to memo No. 365/A&FRC dated 07.07.2022 by your good office. It is pertinent to mention that the petitions challenging the virus of 2012 Act have now been adjourned sine die vide order dated 21.07.2022.

It is surprising that despite the pendency of the aforementioned petitions and the question of law being *sub judice* before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the memo No. 365/A&FRC dated 07.07.2022 has been issued. We request that in view of the question of law being pending consideration of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and the Hon'ble High Court for the states of Punjab and Haryana, the memo No. 365/A&FRC dated 07.07.2022 be withdrawn with immediate effect.

	Instructions regarding maintenance of Accounts by Institution
(i)	Every Private Technical Educational Institution shall maintain accounts on the basis of accounting principles applicable to non business organization, not for profit organization i.e. it shall keep the accounts on "Fund Based Accounting" under accrual basis of accounting.
(ii)	A Private Technical Educational Institution may be allowed development fee not exceeding fifteen percent of the total amount of tuition fee. The development fee shall be treated as capital receipt and shall be collected only if the institution maintains "Depreciation Reserve Fund" equivalent to the depreciation charges in the revenue accounts.
(iii)	The society, trust, organization, association of person, company, firm or any legal entity owning the Private Technical Educational Institution shall be required to maintain separate accounts for the society, trust, organization, association of person, firms and the institution, as the case may be. If the society, trust, organization, association of person, company, firm or any legal entity owning the Private Technical Educational Institution, is running more than one institution, then separate accounts shall be maintained for each institutions. It be ensured that account statement annexed with the proposal are of the institute and in particular regarding the course for which fixation/revision of fee has been sought and not of trust, which run this institute, or is joint statement of number of institute run by a common body i.e. trusts or society.

Points for consideration and factors relevant while calculating the basic tuition fee (BTF) for a course.

- 1. Factors relevant for determination of fee shall be as per the provisions of section 17(1) of the Haryana Private Technical Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Fee) Act, 2012.
- 2. Cost of faculty includes cost of teaching faculty and supporting staff (Non teaching staff). Instructions of AICTE/PCI/council of Architecture or any other regulatory body for such course shall be the basis while calculating cost of faculty as per prescribed teacher: student ratio and salary structure of the faculty shall be as prescribed by the above referred regulatory bodies.
- 3. Operation and Maintenance charges as defined in section 17(1) of Act of 2012 shall include:
- Expenses on books, Journals, Computers, equipments, software, peripherals networking, server, maintenance of website, Electricity, water, telephone/mobile facility for the office/staff/ faculty, sports, advertisement, basic medical facility for faculty/students, documentation, photocopy etc. shall be taken towards operational cost. This list is not exhaustive and other expenses if any, as justified by the institutes/universities or which appear reasonable to the committee may also be taken and considered towards operational expenses.
- ii) The cost of maintenance of existing peripherals /infrastructure shall also form part of operational and maintenance charges.
- The books once purchased shall be used for minimum period of 4 years for coming batches of that course for which it has been purchased and the cost of journals shall not exceed 10% of total cost of books. The books prescribed by the regulatory authorities like AICTE/PCI/Council of Architecture etc. will be preferred while purchasing the books for a particular course. The Institute /Universities may also purchase other book relevant for a course. It may also purchase books for pleasure reading of the students as it deemed fit within the cost factor of 10% prescribed for purchase of journals.

- iv) The life span of the computers and connected peripherals shall be as per the instructions of Govt. of Haryana issued from time to time.
- v) The cost of software, peripherals, networking, server etc. shall be contained upto the limit of 50% of the cost of computers.
- vi) Annual Cost of Non Teaching Faculty including administrative and supporting staff shall not exceed 35% of the cost of teaching faculty. If any institute seeking revision of fee for a pharmacy course intends to claim more than 35% of the cost of teaching faculty towards non-teaching faculty related to pharmacy course, it will furnish full details with reasons for making such claim, which will be considered by the Committee while considering the fixation/revision of fee and it may be allowed cost of non-teaching faculty upto 45% of cost of teaching faculty. Any institute which intend to claim more than 35% or 45% of expenses on teaching faculty as discussed above, towards cost of non teaching faculty shall provide justification and specific reason for such claim.
- vi (a) The institute shall certify that teaching and non-teaching faculty as shown in column 16 & 17 of Form B of fee proposal is exclusively for the course for which fixation of fee has been sought. In case teaching or non-teaching faculty is also being used for student of other courses, the detail of the same be mentioned separately.
- vii) While purchasing and justifying the expenses on books, computers/equipments, sanctioned intake capacity of the institute /number of students actually admitted in a particular course shall be relevant factor. The above expenses shall also be regulated as per instructions/guidelines of regulatory body for that course.
- 4. The fee shall be collected semester wise i.e. at the time of start of a particular semester and not for entire year.
- 5. Following legal expenses shall be considered towards operational expenses:
 - a) Reply to the legal notice served by any student, their parents/guardians or representatives.
 - b) On defending the case filed in Court by a student, his guardians, parents or representatives.

- c) On legal opinion taken by an institute on any issues which has cropped up during the process of admission. However, no such expenses will be admissible where the opinion is taken regarding implementation of guidelines issued by the universities, regulatory bodies of the course like AICTE/PCI etc.
- Note: The institution while claiming the legal expenses as aforesaid will furnish the details in as annexure with justification and also attached proof of payment of fee to the Counsel/legal experts. It is made clear that fee paid through cheque/electronics mode or any other banking process shall only be considered as expenses.
- 6. For the purpose of fee calculation the relevant factor will be actual sanctioned strength of students for the course.
- 7. To attract the students for a particular course an Institute /University has to spent on advertisement. The expenses on advertisement shall not exceed Rs.750/- per student per annum. The expenses beyond this limit shall not be considered by the committee while computing the fee.
- 8. As the expenses on purchase and Maintenance of new books, computers peripherals, infrastructure etc. are considered towards operational expenses while calculating the fee and life span of books/computer etc. is prescribed after which the institute /university may opt for purchase of new item as per its requirement, as such, depreciation cost will not be considered towards operational expenses.
- 9. The payment of interest on Loan shall not taken into consideration for determining the fee structure.
- 10. The development fee shall not exceed 15% of the basic tuition fee as provision of Section 19(2) of the Haryana Private Technical Educational Institution (Regulation of Admission and Fee) Act, 2012.
- 11. "Institutions, in which 75% of the eligible programmes are accredited by NBA or any other agency authorized by Government or have been granted Autonomous status by AICTE with a minimum of 50% of the eligible programmes accredited may charge Tuition Fee 25% more than the BTF".

- 12. Institute may prefer to seek revision of fee for its courses every three years. Till the fee is revised it will continue to charge the fee already fixed by the Committee. No Institute will charge fee other than the fee determined by Committee (Section 11 of Act No.18 of 2012).
- 13. Committee may take note of instructions issued by AICTE/PCI/Council of Architecture or any other regulatory body for a particular course in matters relating fixation of fee of any course and consider any other relevant factor as it deemed fit, while calculating expenses of an institute and fixing fee of a course.
- 14. The proforma shall be supported with the information provided to AICTE/PCI affiliating universities/HSBTE alongwith Form 16 issued to the faculty for the last two sessions so that the fee revision proforma can be analyzed in view of the information submitted to regulatory bodies/affiliating bodies.
- 15. The fee proposal proforma shall also be supported with mandatory disclosures as per the format provided by AICTE/Affiliating bodies.
- 16. The expenses under the head other operating expenses in Column 18 of Form B (Operational and Maintenance Charges) shall be considered only if a separate annexure giving the details of these expenses is annexed with the Proforma.

Instructions for submission of Fee Fixation Proposal for B.Voc, D.Voc and Skill Diploma Courses for the Academic Session 2024-25.

The enclosed proforma be used for B.Voc, D.Voc and Skill Diploma Courses. While submitting the fee proposal the Institute will take note of following instructions:-

- 1. While submitting the application the Institute will confine their expenses as per the instructions/guidelines issued by UGC, AICTE or any other regulatory authority appointed by State or Union Government concerning the faculty, infrastructure like library, classroom, computer centre etc.
- 2. The Institute will specify the already existing infrastructure which is to be used for vocational courses and confine the expenses for the course keeping in view the additional resources required.
- 3. The fee proposal will be considered by the Committee as per the guidelines and other instructions issued by State of Haryana, Technical Education Board, Haryana, Affiliating University, AICTE, UGC or any other competent authority.
- 4. The Institute may specify the expenses specially required for the vocational course, which are in addition to the information called in fee proforma, on a separate sheet, giving justification for such expenses.
- 5. The Institute will take note of the guideline concerning B.Voc Course issued by UGC that the University/College should use its regular faculty for the conduct of general education component and also for the skill components, if existing. Additionally, they may hire faculty on contractual basis and guest faculty in the core trades only as per UGC norms.

The Institute will also take note of AICTE guidelines which provide norm for running vocational courses as follows:-

- The existing resources of the Institution including faculty, Library, Class Room, Computer Centre, etc. shall be used for running the Vocational courses subject to the condition that AICTE approval had been granted for same or allied sector for regular courses.
- All the requirement shall be met with existing infrastructure/facilities for conduct of programmes under consideration.
- The faculty student ratio shall be 1:30 or whatever applicable by respective Board/University.

(For detailed instructions/guidelines, handbook/notifications issued by UGC, AICTE and State Govt. may be referred.)

6. The instructions for other course as far as applicable shall also apply for B.Voc, D.VOC and Skill Development course.

Greetings from The NorthCap University, Gurugram.

We are in receipt of your memo no. 206/A&FRC dated 22.03.2023 wherein revised fee fixation / revision proposal for Academic Session 2024-2025 for technical courses has been sought in exercise of powers conferred under section 3 of the Haryana Private Technical Education Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Fee) Act, 2012 within certain timelines and as per the terms and conditions specified in the referenced memo.

It appears that the said memo has been issued under the Haryana Private Technical Education Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Fee) Act, 2012, the vires of which has been challenged in Civil Writ Petition No. 6229 of 2013 titled 'Educate India Society & Anr. vs. State of Haryana & Ors.' as well as in Civil Writ Petition No. 19393 of 2013 titled 'B.S. Anangpuria Charitable Trust & Ors. vs. State of Haryana & Ors.', before the Hon'ble High Court for the State of Punjab and Haryana.

We also bring to your kind attention that vide order dated: 06.12.2013 in Civil Writ Petition no. 19393 of 2013 titled 'B.S. Anangpuria Charitable Trust & Ors. vs. State of Haryana & Ors.', the Hon'ble High Court was pleased to restrain the Government of Haryana to not give effect to any decision under the 2012 Act without the leave of the Hon'ble Court. The same observation was reiterated vide order dated: 30.06.2021 in Civil Writ Petition No. 6229 of 2013 titled, 'Educate India Society & Anr. vs. State of Haryana & Ors.'





It is pertinent to mention that the petitions challenging the vires of the Act have now been adjourned sine dine vide order dated 21.07.2022.

As the subject matter is sub judice before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, and the Hon'ble High Court for the state of Punjab & Haryana, the memo no. 206/A&FRC dated 22.03.2023 be withdrawn or in the interregnum no steps be taken towards its implementation. Since, actions in pursuance of the memo no. 206/A&FRC dated 22.03.2023 would be in the teeth of the interim order passed by the Hon'ble High Court for the State of Punjab & Haryana.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING

The Chairperson welcomed all members to the 33rd meeting of the Academic Council of The NorthCap University. She also welcomed and introduced the 03 new members of the Academic Council. She thereafter requested the member secretary to proceed with the agenda of the day.

The Member Secretary welcomed all members to the meeting and proceeded to the agenda items.

ITEM NO. 1: CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF XXXII MEETING OF ACADEMIC COUNCIL held on 17 May 2023, circulated by email on 06.06.2023 and enclosed as Annexure 1, including confirmation and progress on matters arising thereof. (Member Secretary)

The Minutes of the XXXII Academic Council Meeting were confirmed by the members of the Academic Council, as there were no observations received on the circulated minutes by e-mail.

ITEM NO. 2: CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE ACADEMIC COUNCIL STANDING COMMITTEE HELD ON 10.11.2023.

(Member Secretary)

The member secretary apprised the members that there was a need to conduct the Standing Committee Academic Council meeting due to the following reason: -

- To seek approval for conferring degrees to the graduated students in the XII Convocation Ceremony scheduled on December 15, 2023.
- For approval of the Academic Calendar the Even Semester (January to June 2024) of the Academic Year 2023-24.
- For ratification of the Promotion Criteria for Undergraduate programs.
- To approve the proposal of offering certification / Diploma / PG Diploma courses from Jan-Feb 2024 under CDOE.
- To deliberate on the Table Agenda from NCU School of Business

The Standing committee meeting was held on 10th November 2023 and the Minutes of the meeting were circulated vide email dated 20th November 2023. The Minutes are enclosed as **Annexure 2.**

Members of the Academic Council noted the above and confirmed the minutes of the meeting of the Standing Committee of the Academic Council held on 10 November 2023.

ITEM NO. 3: STUDENT ADMISSION FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2023-24.

(Member Secretary)

Member secretary updated the members about the intake and the total number of students admitted to various programmes for the Academic year 2023-24, for which the last date of admission was 31.10.2023. Details are as under.

Following points were discussed:

- 1. Dr. Kumkum Garg expressed concern regarding less admissions in BCA and BCA Sound Engineering. Prof. H M Gupta also pointed out that there are less number of seats offered in M.Tech. and the university should offer more seats in M.Tech. Prof. Hedge also mentioned the low number of students in the Law programs.
- 2. Dr. Kavita Khanna shared that the total number of seats in M.Tech is approximately the same in the Delhi Skill and Entrepreneurship university as NCU, as not many students opt for MTech these days. It was also brought out that the students either prefer to take up a job or do MS from abroad rather than doing M.Tech these days. Prof. H M Gupta and Dr. Kumkum Garg highlighted that students should be encouraged to pursue M.Tech in more specialized fields like Semi Conductor Devices & Technology, VLSI, Green mobility, Sustainable Development etc.

3. The Chairperson highlighted that apart from the regular BCA program, the university is offering two more specialized programs viz. BCA in Game Development and BCA Media & Information Technology. She informed the Council that the 03 new B.Sc. programmes namely B.Sc. Sound Engineering, B.Sc. Visual Communication and B.Sc. Visual Effects & Animation which have been started in the University in 2023. She further added that the combined intake of various BCA/BSc. Programs offered by Centre for Media & Entertainment is 200 which is same as last year.

The members of the Academic Council took note of the above along with number of students admitted in the Academic Year 2023-2024.

ITEM NO. 4.: 'NCU SCHOOL OF BUSINESS' - REVISION OF COURSE CURRICULUM FOR MBA PROGRAMMES

(Dean – NCU School of Business)

Prof. Hemalatha Chandrashekar gave the presentation on the Amendments that NCU School of Business has made in the MBA Scheme which was earlier being offered by SoM&LS, NCU. The Scheme of Study had been shaped up iteratively after incorporating suggestions from the Academic Council Sub Committee duly constituted by the Vice Chancellor, NCU comprising of Dean, Academics, NCU and Advisor Academics. It was also brought out by Prof. Hemalatha that the scheme of study has been benchmarked with IIMs and the AICTE Model Curriculum

The following was discussed:

- No changes in the Scheme of Study 2022-24 since students of this batch were in their final semester.
- Changes in Scheme of Study 2023-25:
 - Semester 2: Five courses retained as in the earlier scheme; Two courses replaced by two others; Two new courses of 2 credits each introduced; the changes were aimed at making the curriculum more industry oriented.
 - Semester 3 & 4: Strategic Management shall continue as core course in Semester 3. Entrepreneurship and Innovation shall be offered as an elective and not as a core course. Major Project shall be retained in Semester 4. Among the twelve electives spread over the 3rd and 4th semesters, 8 would be from the major area of specialization and 4 would be from some minor area / open elective offered within NCU.

(Presentation made by Prof. Hemalatha is placed at **Annexure 3**)

The members of the Academic Council deliberated the above issue and approved the proposed amendments in the MBA scheme of study 2023-2025, with the observation that the list of Electives should be presented before the Academic Council in the next meeting, tentatively scheduled in May 2024 for approval.

ITEM NO. 5.: APPROVAL OF NEW COURSES - SOL AND APS

(HOD - SOL & HOD - APS)

(A) SCHOOL OF LAW

HOD School of Law briefed the members on approval required to commence new Juvenile Justice course as a Programme Elective for five-year BBA.LLB and three-year LL.B programmes.

Points Discussed:

- 1. The Council highlighted that the total number of hours for the course were not clearly defined in the Course Template, and the same needs to be incorporated.
- 2. Prof. Hegde suggested that the School of Law should tie-up with programs like Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao or other civil society so that the students get adequate exposure and can benefit from the practical experiences.
- 3. It was also suggested by Prof H M Gupta that a group can be formed within the School of Law, who can look at the cases of past 20 years on issues involving juvenile crimes. This would provide hands-on experience and better understanding of the issues being faced by society. The Chairperson highlighted that going through this exercise would give an understanding of how the society has evolved and the emerging pattern of the society at large. It was also suggested that the Department of Psychology could be involved in understanding the human behavioral pattern over the years.

Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Studies along with course template are attached at **Annexure 4**.

(B) DEPARTMENT OF APPLIED SCIENCES

HOD Applied Sciences Department briefed the members on approval required to commence new pre-PhD courses, as follows:-

i) Principles of Biochemistry (ASL713)

Department of Applied Sciences proposed to introduce a course for Pre-PhD students, which aims to provide insights about the principles that govern the complex biological systems and their experimental basis. He brought out that it will help the students to carry their research and acquire a specialised knowledge and understanding of selected aspects. The course has L-T-P: 3-0-2, with course credit of 4.

ii) Biophysical Chemistry (ASL 715)

This course aims to explicate the fundamental approaches used by physical chemists to understand the behaviour of biomolecules such as proteins, carbohydrates, nucleic acids etc. It also helps to illustrate practical application to solve biomedical research problems. The course has L-T-P: 3-0-2, with course credit of 4.

Minutes of meeting of Board of Studies, including detailed syllabus of both the courses are enclosed as **Annexure 5**.

Points Discussed:

- **1.** Dr. S D Joshi suggested that these courses can be offered on MOOCs platform if the number of students enrolled are few.
- 2. The members brought out that a good option for introducing such courses was via 'selected topics'. Prof. SD Joshi stated that such courses may have selected topics, without fixed contents. Prof HM Gupta brought out that these are particularly useful for introducing subjects in emerging areas which are normally not offered in regular courses, but nevertheless need to be taught in view of the technology involved, which itself could be in a nascent stage / in the process of maturing. Prof SD Joshi pointed out that the course could be run for one or two cycles, and once it crystallizes, it can be shifted to a regular course. The Vice chancellor suggested that such a course on selected topics should be properly designed with unit-wise course contents, with suggested books, e-content and reading material, before being offered. The syllabus and the credit framework should be approved by Dean Academic Affair's before the commencement of the semester.

Members of the Academic Council noted the details and approved the above proposals.

ITEM No. 06: AMENDMENTS IN PhD RULES & REGULATIONS & UPDATE ON PhD RELATED MATTERS

(Dy. Dean - PhD)

Dy. Dean PhD - Dr. Nitin Malik gave the presentation and briefed all the members regarding the amendments in the PhD rules and regulations. Dr. Nitin also briefed the members about the schemes for financial assistance to faculty members for scholarly publications. Copy of the presentation is placed at **Annexure 6**.

(i) Amendments in PhD Rules & Regulations.

Amendments in PhD Rules and Regulations were discussed in Board of Doctoral Research and recommended for approval by Academic Council.

a) The minimum eligibility criteria for admission in PhD Program Centre for Language Learning (CLL).

The minimum eligibility criteria for admission in PhD Program in CLL has been revised from 60% to 55% in CLL, citing difficulty in getting first division in English Literature

b) Minimum duration of the PhD program for part-time scholars

The minimum duration for submission of PhD Thesis has been revised to 3 years for both Full-Time and Part-Time scholars.

1. Dr. Kumkum Garg observed that 03 years could be less time for the students to finish their Ph.D and also whether it is as per UGC norms. It was clarified that as per UGC norms issued in Nov. 2022 three years is the "minimum" time in which student can complete Ph.D.. It was brought out that, at NCU, it usually takes approximately 5 years for students to complete their Ph.D.

The Academic Council members took note of the proposed amendments in PhD rules and regulations, and the revised policy for financial assistance for publications by faculty and PhD scholars aimed at improving quality and number of research publications.

2. Scheme for financial assistance to faculty members for scholarly publications. Research Outcomes form an important and significant component of a University's USP, and have a major bearing on the Rankings and Accreditations like NIRF & NAAC etc. The number of publications and citations have a heavy weightage in the "Research and Professional Practice" segment of such rankings. For mobilising research grants from DST and other funding agencies also, the h-index of the university is an important parameter. Increase in number of publications increases the citation index and h-index of a university, thereby aiding ease of getting funding. To boost the number of such publications in good quality journals with SCI/ESCI/ Scopus and other recognized indexing, it was felt that requisite impetus needs to be accorded for motivating/ facilitating faculty members to publish more papers in such journals. Towards this, two 'cash incentive' based schemes have been identified to achieve a target of two journal publications and two book chapters annually, in the next 1-2 years. Scheme 1 focusses on research publications in Scopus/ SCI indexed open access journals, and provides for reimbursement of processing fee granted as scholarship to faculty members. Scheme 2 pertains to scholarship to faculty members for publishing in unpaid recognized indexed journals. The amount of scholarship money varies depending on

3. Strategic implementation of blended teaching-learning.

The NorthCap University Gurugram has consistently demonstrated its commitment to innovative teaching and learning methods, continually striving for educational excellence. In alignment with this commitment, NCU has meticulously crafted a comprehensive plan to seamlessly integrate online teaching into on-campus programmes. This initiative spans across three distinguished schools: SOET, SOM & LS, and SOL, and has evolved through extensive discussions among stakeholders at all levels. The action plan centre's around adopting blended courses (First-Year Courses: Face-to-face delivery for all first year UG courses, with up to 50% blended mode in PG programs. Second-Year Courses: 10% blended mode for UG (except law), up to 50% in PG with MOOC options. Third and Fourth-Year Courses: Minimum 15% MOOC mode in UG (except law programs) and PG programs). Practice Sessions for Blended courses retain the face-to-face approach, evaluated by the university. Equivalent external courses from reputed MOOC platforms have been identified to complement NCU courses in a blended mode. The Evaluation Process would comprise of university-conducted summative evaluations (Minor and major tests). Faculty assignments based on enrolment to maintain a reasonable student-to-faculty ratio, ensuring effective and quality evaluations aligned with NCU standards has been ensured. Detailed guidelines have been framed and quality assured through adherence to best practices for evaluations with regular compliance reports. Blended mode reduces face-to-face lecture commitments, allowing faculty to focus on research. Advanced learners can opt for up to 40% of total credits in Full MOOC Mode.

4. Convocation Ceremony – 15 December 2023

NCU held its 12th Annual Convocation Ceremony for its various undergraduate and postgraduate programmes on 15 December 2023. The event was a memorable one and was presided over by Hon'ble Prof. T. G. Sitharam, Chairman, AICTE. A total of 734 students were awarded degrees in their respective disciplines, including 429 from BTech, 4 from BSc Maths (H), 04 from BSc Data Science (H), 07 from BSc Chemistry (H), 07 from BSc Physics (H), 37 from BCom (H), 13 from BA Economic (H), 16 from BA Psychology (H), 87 from BBA, 64 from BBA-LLB (H), 11 from MTech, 28 from MBA, 9 from LLM and 18 awarded PhD. Points Discussed:

- 1. Dr. Kumkum Garg inquired about the status of the MOUs and whether they were active or not. Dr. Sharda informed the members about the MOUs, bringing out that they are active, and NCU has been regularly conducting immersion programs, student exchange programs with these universities. 03 students from CSE Department are joining the immersion program in April 2024. It was also highlighted that faculty members from Santa Clara are visiting NCU on 2nd February 2024 to discuss the credit framework, course mapping etc. towards offering Dual degree with Santa Clara University. It was also highlighted that the requirement of GMAT / GRE scores has also been waived off for NCU students. She also brought out that articulation with Queensland University is in progress to offer Dual Degree wherein the students can complete 02 years at NCU and 02 years at the Queensland University. Dr. Kumkum Garg asked if it is as per the UGC regulations. The Chairperson highlighted that since NCU is a NAAC "A" accredited university, it is eligible to offer dual degrees. It was also brought out that NCU is in the process of offering Semester Exchange program with Binus University.
- 2. In other discussions, Dr. Kavita Khanna brought out that as per NEP2020, all Honours programs are to be of 04 years duration. Dean Academics clarified that NEP 2020 says that it is recommended to have Honours program as 04 years program, however it is not mandatory. He also brought out that currently, 02 Honours program at NCU have been offered as 4 years programs, and by 2025-2026, NCU intends to offer all the Honours programs as 4 years programs.

The Academic Council took note of these items and complimented NCU for their continuous efforts at improving the learning experience and introducing new and latest technologies.

Discussion on Medal awardees:

It was decided that the decision on awarding medals should be revisited. A committee under the chairmanship of Advisor Academic Affairs will decide the type of medal (Gold, Silver) to be awarded to rank holders and link them with CGPA. Dean (Academic Affairs) requested that the committee may examine if the scheme can be implemented w.e.f. Convocation 2023 or next year onwards.

The recommendations of the above committee will be placed before the next Academic Council Meeting for ratification.

ITEM NO. 2: APPROVAL OF THE ACADEMIC CALENDAR FOR THE NEXT SEMESTER, I.E., THE EVEN SEMESTER (JANUARY TO JUNE 2024) OF THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2023-24

The Dean Academics presented the Academic Calendar for the Even Semester (January to June 2024) of the Academic Year 2023-24. (Annexure 2)

The same was approved by the Committee.

ITEM NO. 3: RATIFICATION OF THE PROMOTION CRITERIA FOR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS

The Academic Office at NCU has observed that in the post-COVID years, the overall performance of undergraduate students has fallen significantly below the pre-COVID standards. This decline can be attributed to the disruption in students' learning during their crucial school years. It is anticipated that it may take few years to return to pre-COVID academic levels.

In light of these circumstances, the Academic Office, NCU, has received approval from the Chairperson of the Academic Council to temporarily adjust the promotion requirements for all undergraduate programs across all batches. This adjustment will be in effect for a five-year period, commencing from the Academic Year 2023-24 onwards. The criteria will be reevaluated and rationalized once this period has concluded, contingent on the situation at that time.

The matter was discussed in detail by the members, and was ratified by the Committee. (Annexure 3)

ITEM NO. 4: APPROVAL TO OFFER ONLINE CERTIFICATION / DIPLOMA / PG DIPLOMA COURSES FROM JAN-FEB 2024 SESSION UNDER CDOE

The proposal shared by Dr. Anjali regarding offering certification program through CDOE was examined and the following observations were made:

- The scheme and credit framework needs to be aligned with NEP 2020 and the student will be required to earn minimum 20 credits to become eligible for NCU certification in online mode.
- 2. Out of the 20 credits, at least 10 credits (50%) would be delivered by NCU in asynchronous mode and the remaining credits can be earned through reputed MOOCs offered by NPTEL, UDEMY, COURSERA, CCNA, AWS, EDEX or industry partner.
- The CDOE will create a Dept. of Science and Technology and a Dept. of Legal Studies
 with dedicated staff and form a BoS for each dept. with members from industry duly
 approved by the VC, NCU for offering any certification and diploma through CDOE.
- 4. Director CDOE was advised to follow due process as prescribed by DEB UGC without taking any short-cuts and compromising on quality.

Table Agenda from NCU School of Business Studies

The agenda from NCU School of Business was received on 8th Nov 2023 by email and the details were made available on 9th Nov 2023 to the Registrar office. The agenda was tabled on 10th Nov during the Academic Council meeting and was deliberated upon.

The Academic Council members noted the following observations:

- a. The minutes of the Board of Studies meeting were found to be inadequately drafted.
- b. The constitution of the Board of Studies had not received due approval from the competent authority.
- c. Subject codes were not assigned in the proposed scheme for the MBA 4th Semester.
- d. The credit framework of NCU, which is compliant with the National Education Policy (NEP), was not adhered to.
- e. The proposed teaching scheme for the MBA 4th semester was neither in compliance with NEP nor aligned with the NCU course structure prescribed for MBA students.

In view of the above the agenda item was Not Approved and The Dean of the NCU School of Business was requested to adhere to proper procedures and implement a teaching scheme that aligns with the course curriculum of the MBA program in accordance with the National Education Policy (NEP) and the guidelines set forth by NCU.

The Dean, NCU School of Business was requested to revisit the agenda item thoroughly and prepare proper proposal with detailed course curricula along with a well-defined syllabus clearly mentioning L-T-P, Pre-requisites, Program Outcomes, Course Outcomes, etc as per AICTE norms.

The revised agenda item can be placed before the next Academic Council Meeting scheduled in the month of Jan 2024 for approval.

The Dean NCU School of Business would ensure that the agenda item reaches the Registrar office at least 15 days in advance so that it is duly scrutinised by the Dean (Academic Affairs) before it is placed before the Academic Council for approval.

There being no other point, the meeting ended at 3:30 PM with a Vote of Thanks to the Chair.

Members unanimously accepted his resignation and acknowledged with thanks his valued participation as a member of the Finance Committee. (Annexure -2)

3) To place on record the appointment of Mr. Akshay Makhija as a member of the Finance Committee in place of Mr. N K Dewan.

Members unanimously approved the appointment of Mr. Akshay Makhija as a member of the Finance Committee as nominee of the Chancellor.

Members unanimously approved the reconstitution of the Finance Committee and welcomed the new members and looked forward to their active participation.

5) To consider and approve expenditure for upgrading of lighting in the classrooms of the new building.

Members unanimously approved an amount not exceeding ₹8 Lakhs for upgrading of lighting in the classrooms of the new building as per estimate attached. (Annexure – 3)

6) To consider and approve expenditure on graphics to be installed in classrooms, laboratories, and corridors.

Members unanimously accorded approval for an amount not exceeding ₹4 Lakhs for the same. (Annexure -4)

7) To place on record the competitive quotes received for renewal of the group medical insurance and to approve the proposal of M/s Care Health Insurance.

Considering Care Health Insurance had made the most competitive offer which the existing insurer ICICI Lombard was unable to match, members unanimously accorded post-facto approval to the proposal received from M/s Care Health Insurance on the same, if not better, terms and conditions. Members authorized Ms. Ruth D.D. of M/s Tower Watson to negotiate on our behalf. (Annexure - 5)

8) To approve expenditure on refurbishment of two classrooms on the ground floor of the existing building.

Members unanimously approved an expenditure for an amount not exceeding ₹40 Lakhs for refurbishment of two classrooms (Room No. 002 & 032) on the ground floor of the existing building. (Annexure – 6)

- 9) To approve estimate for civil, electrical, plumbing and facade work of the newly constructed building in the central courtyard.
 - a) Members unanimously approved the estimate for civil, electrical, plumbing and facade work of the newly constructed building in the central courtyard. Members unanimously approved the estimate for completion of the same within an amount not exceeding ₹6 Crores. It was also agreed that this work is to be completed on or before 30th April 2024.
 - b) Members also approved the proposal to allot the Ground Floor and half of the First Floor of the building for the purpose of all courses being conducted in collaboration with Seamedu. (Annexure 7)

10) To consider and approve unsecured loan of upto ₹3 Crores from Har Shree Jee Finance and Leasing Company Ltd. – (NBFC) RBI Certificate No. 8-14-02044.

To part finance the cost of completion of the aforesaid building and considering the inadequacy of funds to carry out this capital expenditure, members unanimously agreed to get it part financed. The rate of interest applicable on this loan will be the same as the ongoing loan provided by Har Shree Jee Finance and Leasing Company Ltd. For this purpose, members unanimously authorized M/s Avdhesh Mishra and M/s Shiv Saran Mehra to jointly execute all the necessary documentation for the said funding. It was agreed that the funds will be taken in two tranches as under:

- A) ₹2 Crores upfront in the month of October 2023 and
- B) ₹1 Crore in April 2024.
- 11) To consider the audited Balance Sheet along with the Auditor's Report and income and expenditure account for the year ending March 2023 and to recommend its adoption, if at all, to Educate India Society.

Members unanimously approved the audited Balance Sheet along with the Auditor's Report and income and expenditure account for the year ending March 2023 and agreed to recommend its adoption by the Managing Committee of Educate India Society and the Board of Management and Governing Body of The NorthCap University. (Annexure – 8)

12) To consider and approve reappointment of S. Ramanand Aiyar & Co. as Statutory Auditor for the Financial Year 2023-24.

Members unanimously approved the reappointment of S. Ramanand Aiyar & Co. as Statutory Auditor for the Financial Year 2023-24 on the same terms and conditions.

13) To place on record the declaration submitted to Canara Bank with respect to OD and other limits of current accounts.

The declaration submitted to Canara Bank with respect to OD and other limits of current accounts was taken on record. (Annexure – 9)

14) To place on record the opening of a Zero Balance Saving Account with Bank of Maharashtra as per the requirement of Department of Science & Technology (DST).

The opening of a Zero Balance Saving Account with Bank of Maharashtra as per the requirement of DST was taken on record. Any two of M/s Avdhesh Mishra, M/s Shiv Saran Mehra, M/s Akshay Makhija and M/s Zorawar Daulet Singh are jointly authorized to operate this account. (Annexure – 10)

15) To place on record the report of Foreign Exchange Exposure submitted to Kotak Mahindra Bank for the quarter ending 30th June 2023.

The report of Foreign Exchange Exposure submitted to Kotak Mahindra Bank by the CF & AO for the quarter ending 30th June 2023 was taken on record. (Annexure – 11)

16) To place on record the Digital Signature obtained for Educate India Society.

The Digital Signature obtained for Educate India Society was taken on record. Unless otherwise decided, M/s Avdhesh Mishra will be the authorized signatory on behalf of Educate India Society. (Annexure – 12)

17) To consider and approve scholarship of 25% of annual tuition fees to Prakriti Chauhan (23BAP035) as a special case on the ground of low income of her father.

Members unanimously approved scholarship of 25% of annual tuition fees to Prakriti Chauhan (23BAP035) as a special case on the ground of low income of her father. Continuation of the scholarship will be subject to applicable rules. (Annexure – 13)

18) To consider and approve scholarships to students for completing AWS Certification Course @ US \$50 to each student.

Members unanimously approved scholarships of upto US \$50 per student for completing AWS Certification Course. The scholarship will be distributed on presentation of the Certificate of successful completion by the student and/or confirmation by the Head of the Department. (Annexure -14)

19) To consider and approve the deletion of name of Col. Bikram Mohanty (Retd.) as authorized signatory in Account No. 824720116690 held in the name of NCU RESEARCH.

Following his retirement from NCU, members unanimously approved deletion of the name of Col. Bikram Mohanty (Retd.) as authorized signatory and approved addition of the name of Cmde. Diwakar Tomar NM (Retd.) as a signatory in his place. The other authorized signatories in this account are M/s Avdhesh Mishra and M/s Shiv Saran Mehra. Any two signatories can operate this account. (Annexure – 15)

20) To consider bifurcation of the fee to meet capital expenses of the University.

The CF & AO brought to the attention of members that aside from new capital items, there is now an urgent need to incur expenditure on renovating / refurbishment of classrooms, laboratories, common areas etc. due to normal wear & tear as most of the buildings are now over 20 years and in some cases 25 years. Since the amount for refurbishment will be fairly large and cannot be recovered in one go, she has proposed that the fee be recovered as under from Batches commencing 2024-25:

- Tuition fee 80% of total fee
- Development Fee 20% of total fee

Development Fee will be used for renovation and refurbishment of older infrastructure. After careful consideration of the matter, members unanimously agreed with the proposal of CF & AO and approved the same w.e.f. Batches commencing 2024-25.

21) To consider and approve allocation of the top two floors of the front glass building to the School of Business and to approve an expenditure of upto ₹25 Lakhs to reconfigure and equip it appropriately.

Members unanimously agreed that the top two floors of the front glass building be used by the School of Business exclusively. They also agreed to an expenditure of upto ₹25 Lakhs for its reconfiguration. (Annexure – 16)

22) To consider and accord post-facto approval for scholarships and fee payment options category wise for Online Degree Programmes and for NIOS students for the year 2023-24.

Members unanimously approved scholarships and fee payment options category wise for Online Degree Programmes and for NIOS students for the year 2023-24. (Annexure – 17)

23) To consider and to accord approval for expenditure on the following capital works.

Members unanimously accorded approval for the following capital works covering cost of material and labour: i) Replacement of Kota stone - ₹6,58,114/-, ii) Electrical works - ₹10,51,504/-, iii) Tiling work - ₹7,08,000/-, iv) Modular furniture and chairs - ₹3,54,000/-, v) Tile work - ₹6,53,486/-, vi) Office furniture - ₹9,02,700/-. Copies of all the estimates / bills are attached as **Annexure** – **18**.

24) To consider and approve taking an overdraft of upto ₹3 Crores from Canara Bank as bridge finance to meet the recurring costs.

CF & AO explained that bridge finance was needed for 2 months till the 2nd semester fees is received. Since Kotak Mahindra Bank has not released the overdraft limit, it was necessary to approach Canara Bank or any other bank which offers the best terms. Members unanimously approved the need for the aforesaid overdraft and authorized M/s Avdhesh Mishra and M/s Shiv Saran Mehra to jointly execute all documents needed in this regard. It was agreed that the overdraft will be liquified on or before 31st December 2023.

25) To consider the view of the auditor on applicability of GST on invoice of Cintana.

Members decided to refer the matter to Ms. Lalitha Krishnamurthy for her opinion on the matter since there was a difference of opinion between the internal and external auditor on the applicability of GST. The opinion is attached herewith as **Annexure -19**. In any case, the external auditor has advised that an Indemnification or bank guarantee be obtained from Cintana in case a demand and/or penalty is imposed subsequently. This indemnification is sought to indemnify and keep indemnifying NCU against any such demand or penalty.

Any other matter:

26) To consider and approve the expenditure for Admissions Outreach Activities by the School of Business.

Members unanimously approved an expenditure of an amount not exceeding ₹8.5 Lakhs + GST for IMS Learning and ₹12 Lakhs + GST for Career Launcher towards Admissions Outreach Activities by the School of Business. (Annexure – 20)

27) To consider and approve Scholarship of US\$150 per participant for the NCU Immersion Programme 2024.

Members were informed that to encourage internationalization within the University, a scholarship of US \$150 per participant be given to partially mitigate the cost of international students visiting NCU on an exchange / immersion programme. This being the first foreign Immersion Programme at NCU, for it to succeed, it is felt that the scholarship is necessary. The proposal was unanimously approved. (Annexure – 21)

28) To consider and approve an expenditure of upto ₹19 Lakhs for Momentum 2023.

Members unanimously approved this expenditure based on the recommendation of the Momentum Committee. (Annexure – 22)

29) To place on record the loss of Master Policy No. 320940 of the Employee Group Gratuity taken by Educate India Society.

CF & AO informed members that the aforesaid policy is untraceable. Members unanimously decided that a First Information Report be filed with the Police and thereafter an Indemnity Bond be submitted to LIC by Mr. Shiv Saran Mehra for issue of duplicate Master Policy. (Annexure – 23)

There being no other matter, the meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
